Message from Pastor Jeff

We have been talking for several months about how different styles of worship may attract different groups of people. But for visitors, what do you suppose is the single most important factor in determining whether they will come back to a worship service again?

- the music style?
- the preaching?
- the children's programs?
- the youth group?

Research indicates the most important question visitors are asking during their first visit is whether this church is friendly or not. And the primary way visitors determine whether a church is friendly is the number of people who initiate a conversation with them.

Interviews with visitors indicate that there is a ten minute window in their overall visit when they are most (or least) impressed with the church's "friendliness." That moment is the first ten minutes following the service. During this brief

window of time, more than any other, newcomers are assessing whether the church is genuinely friendly.

In the past I have asked you to follow the "First Five Rule" where you take the first five minutes after a worship service ends to seek out a visitor and introduce yourself. Now I want to report that over the last couple of years I have consistently heard the same thing from our visitors, "Your church is so friendly!"



The newcomers have told me how you have invited them to join you in a Sunday school class or to your homes for a meal after church! You have told them what you like about being a part of this church, and you have helped their children find the right Sunday school class.

This is the kind of ministry that draws individuals and whole families to the Lord. Keep up the excellent work because worship styles may attract people initially, but friendliness will keep them coming back!

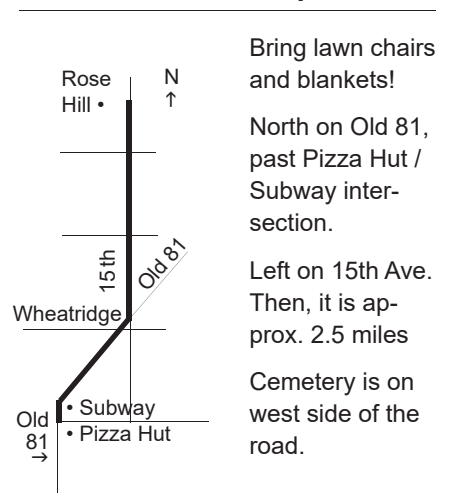
Scrapbook & Craft Retreat

Behold, how good and how pleasant it is For brothers to dwell together in unity! -Psalm 133:1

Several years ago I ran across a book titled *For Women Only*. I cannot think of a title that would be more likely to provoke me to read a book than that one. "What is in that book," I wondered, "that they don't want men to read?" So I read it. Or perhaps, it read me. The author, Shaunti Feldhahn, was trying to help women understand how men think and what makes us tick. I found it uncannily accurate, and I heartily recommend it to all women, married or single.

A few weeks ago I ran across another book by the same author (she actually co-authored this one with Craig Gross). It is called *Through a Man's Eyes: Helping Women Understand the Visual Nature of Men*. (In my defense, I bought this one because it was on sale.) This book takes chapter six of her earlier work and expands it to another short volume. (174 pages). And again, I cannot recommend this book more highly.

As the title suggests, the authors explore how God wired men to be predominantly visual creatures. They explain the neurological process that powerfully and inextricably links a man's vision and



sexuality. For example, while condemning all sexual sin, including pornography, the authors explain why porn is often a stumbling block for many men. Again, they do not excuse or trivialize sin, but they do help us understand why it is so incredibly difficult for most men to walk in righteousness in the area of their sexuality. And it offers Christian women a way that they can serve their brothers in Christ and help us walk in moral purity with God. It also offers some very wise and practical advice about how to disciple and guide our sons through the cultural morass of our sex-saturated society.

I recommend this book to any woman who has a male in her life: a husband, a boyfriend, a son, a boss, even a pastor. This book will offer you keen insight into the minds and hearts of men, things that many men don't even understand themselves, much less the ability to explain to someone else. And for that reason, although again the book is geared toward women, I even recommend this book to men. I benefitted from it greatly, and I hope some of you will too. If you are interested, please ask our friendly church librarian to assist you in locating a copy.

Camp Policy

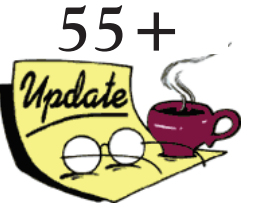
It is our intention at Evangelical Covenant Church, Lindsborg that every child would have the opportunity to go to camp. We realize that not every family may be able to afford the full amount of the camp fee. Therefore, the following options are available:

A) Pay the deposit (\$30 for Covenant Kids, \$75 for Jr./Sr. High) which will accompany the registration form, and then pay the balance when it is due. (Balance due is: Trailblazer \$155 or Explorer \$230, due at the church office by noon Monday, June 2. Jr./Sr. High balance is \$245 if paid before April 1, or \$265 if paid between April 1 and June 1.)

B) Pay the deposit (see above) which will accompany the registration form, and then the church will cover the balance. You can pay the church back on installments. (Please let the office staff know of your plans when you drop off your registration form and deposit.) Payments may be made to *Covenant Church* marked *camp registration*.

C) Pay the deposit (see above) which will accompany the registration form, and request a camp scholarship for the balance due. Partial scholarships can be worked out if you can pay part of the balance due. Partial scholarships may be requested from Nancy Bolden, 227-2994, for Covenant Kids camp, or for Jr./Sr. High - Jim Christopher, 668-2477.

D) Full scholarships are available for those who are unable to pay the deposit and the balance due. Requests for full scholarships may be made by contacting Nancy Bolden or Jim Christopher, see above contact information.

Missions Reports

From Julie McLaughlin

I just spent the last few days saying our thank you's and farewells to our partners in East Sepik Province. One of the highlights was having Grand Chief Sir Michael Somare on Board our ship. He's PNG's first Prime Minister.

Last week, we finished up our medical outreaches, stopping at remote villages all along the shores of the Sepik River. We were as far as 85 miles up the river.

My favorite day was the one that we partnered with Samaritan Aviation to take a team of medical volunteers out to Murik Lakes, a location the ship can't reach. The float planes took the team out and then brought eye patients on the 5 minute flight back to the ship to receive cataract surgeries. It was a well coordinated effort as planes landed on the river and small boats went ashore in Mabuk village with our regular medical services.

I am filled with a sense of satisfaction as we head into our scheduled maintenance period. We delivered everything that we promised and even more through our key partnerships.

Now, I'm getting some things ready for our next medical outreaches starting in April in West New Britain.

From Covenant World Relief

In partnership with the Zimele Wethu Foundation, the lives of thousands women and children in South Africa are being transformed. Zimele Wethu's mission is for women, youth, and men in South African rural and township communities

to be empowered to work with their inherent gifts and talents for social and economic transformation.

Three phases of community development are designed to bring holistic transformation in the lives of the women and their communities. In the first phase, women work in small groups to build their life,

business, and management skills to successfully operate their own businesses. In the second phase, women pool their resources and work together to address critical community needs by starting larger scale business projects. These projects include community agriculture and craft marketplaces and social service projects that serve marginalized

populations, like orphaned children and HIV/AIDS victims. In the third phase, women create a conglomerate to advocate for social, economic, and health care reforms in their communities including equal rights for women and greater access to clinical care.

Through this proven community development program model, Zimele Wethu is creating long-term, sustainable solutions to poverty that can be replicated and scaled in communities throughout South Africa.

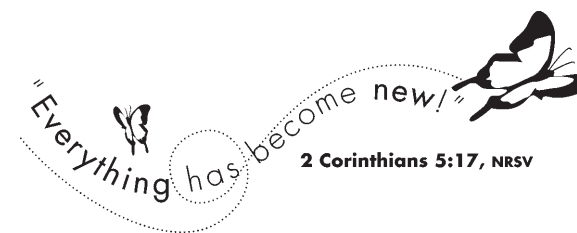

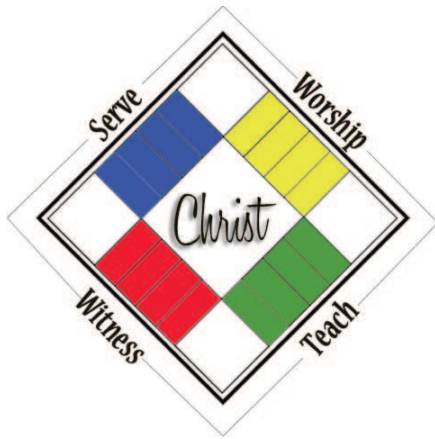
