Message from Pastor Darrell

Have you ever wondered why Jesus was baptized? Mark 1:4 says,

And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

John was trying to get people ready for Jesus and His Kingdom. But before they could put their faith in Jesus and follow Him, they first had to repent. Repentance involves four things:

- 1. Conviction a true perception of our sin
- 2. Confession telling God the truth about our sin
- 3. Commitment a decision to change
- 4. Consequences an actual change in our behavior

Only after repenting are we ready to follow Jesus.

But Jesus didn't need to follow Jesus, and He certainly didn't need to repent. He has never sinned! (2 Cor 5:21; Heb 4:15) Of what could He possibly repent? So why would Jesus join a bunch of sinners in the water proclaiming that He was repenting of sin? Is it any wonder John the Baptist was confused?

Matthew 3:13–14: Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John.

But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?"

Jesus' only response to John was, "Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness." (Matt 3:15)

For a long time that really confused me. What did Jesus mean by "fulfill all righteousness?" How does a sinless person repenting of sin fulfill all righteousness?

If finally received help on this from Scot McKnight. In the 25th chapter of his book, *The Jesus Creed*, he explains that in His baptism Jesus was repenting for us. We need someone to repent *for* us because in our sinful state our repentance is inadequate. Consider the four steps of repentance above. In our sinful state we are never fully *convicted* of our sin, we do not adequately *confess* our sin, and our *commitment* to change and the *fruit* of our repentance is often weak at best. We need someone to repent *for* us.

Enter Jesus. He is our substitute. At the cross He took the *punishment* for our sin. In the Jordan He *repented* of our sin. So, in our baptism we participate with Him in His. We do it imperfectly, but that is OK, because He did it perfectly. By

participating with Him in His baptism we receive Him in the fullness of His baptism - the perfection of His conviction and confession and the fullness of His repentance and fruit. In short, we need Jesus because we cannot even repent right.

We still need to confess, but Jesus makes our true confession a *full* confession. And we still need to repent, but Jesus makes our genuine repentance a *full* repentance. And we still need to be baptized, but Jesus makes our sincere baptism an effective and fruitful baptism. Jesus does these things *for* us and then we do these things *in Him*.

So, have you been baptized? We are doing a baptismal service on Sunday evening, August 6th. It is not too late to join us. If you sense the Spirit prompting you to be baptized, please talk to one of the pastors right away.



We are blessed!





Rules: The child will show respect, honor, and honesty in dealings with:

- 1. Authority
 - a. Parents
 - b. Teachers
 - c. Elders
- 2. Peers and Siblings
- 3. Property
 - a. Church building and grounds
 - b. Personal property of others

Discipline Policy Outlined:

- I. Correct Behavior—encouraged by:
 - A. Verbal praise
 - B. Recognition
- II. Incorrect Behavior
 - A. Innocent, immature
 - 1. Admonishment (warning)
 - 2. Related consequences (the child tells the teacher he is sorry)
 - B. Disobedience, open defiance
 - 1. Admonishment (warning)
 - 2. Admonishment and action (reflective time out)
 - 3. Removal from meeting
 - a. Parental contact
 - b. The child asks forgiveness from teacher upon return, either verbally or written

I really enjoy pioneering and being Ship Manager on board the YWAM Liberty is right up my alley. My job is different every day. One minute I'm talking to Marine professionals, another talk with a group of young PNG volunteers working

cross culturally, next conversation is about cleaning or food preparation, on to medical outreaches and instruments needed for dentistry. I've got Skype meetings about dry docks and another one about crew and volunteers. Then onto discussions about how to get Bibles out and work with the Churches.

I often find a steady stream of people with questions or people needing things. It doesn't stop. What I love most is seeing people's lives transformed. I'm not just talking about someone who receives lifesaving medical Treatment. That's pretty fun. It I also love the look of a volunteer whose world has just been rocked by their outreach experience.

I love a deckhand who comes back to the Lord. I love a young PNG national who discovers a hidden talent.

We'll be heading out to some islands in West New Britain soon. We've just finished our first dental outreach on the Liberty. Now we'll test out our operations in a remote location.
