Message from Pastor Jeremy "Why Do I Take Students To CHIC?"

This coming summer July 15-20 we will be taking students to CHIC at the University of Tennessee. This will be my 7th time going to CHIC including the very first one that I went to as a student in 1991. I have taken well over 150 students to CHIC. This is without a doubt my favorite youth event. CHIC stands for Covenant High In Christ. Students eligible to go are students in grades 9-12 right now. The freshman class of 2021 is eligible to go twice to CHIC, as the class is every 3 years. I encourage you to go the first time, as most of the time after you graduate you are moving on to jobs, experiences for college.

So what makes CHIC so special? First of all, this event has all the ingredients that are essential for an amazing youth conference: There are solid morning seminars that practically help students put feet to their faith. Then there are the over the top activities for every type of kid; including sporting tournaments, bracelet making, spray paint walls, white water rafting, horseback riding, choir, etc. And to top it off a world class evening line up that has included: David Crowder, LeCrae, Louie Giglio, Francis Chan, Eugene Cho, and Chris Tomlin. Every year I bring students back, God has a way of making Himself known to them

in new ways. Sometimes God shows up in drastic ways, other times the process is an unlearning and a painful process too. At CHIC students are brought to the alter to look at their relationship with Christ and to respond.

Students today face pressures like no other times. They need the opportunity to respond to Jesus. Through diverse perspectives and voices they will hear a full picture of what God has for us. They will hear something new about God, and for some students this can be challenging and confronting.

Back when I went to CHIC in 1991 I was in wow of everything. I had never been with a group of people my age that large. I was in wow of the speakers, the bands, the mullets and the diversity. And I was challenged to live my life for Christ and to "Go The Distance" as the theme was that year. Fast forward to 2018 and the truth is youth ministry is a different world. Students are so much more diverse, more knowledgeable and have experienced so much more pain. CHIC does a great job of challenging all students no matter where their walk is or no matter what kind of person they are. CHIC is for all high school students.

So I ask you to do a few things. 1.) Pray for us as leaders to gather students to go to CHIC and to lead well and love well. 2.) Pray for students to respond to the message before, during and after CHIC. 3.) If you have a student, encourage them to go. If you have a grandchild encourage them to go. If you know a high school student encourage them to go. 4.) Give sacrificially to CHIC. I would love to take every student that wants to go. Support our fundraisers. Give checks to LCSM which stands for Lindsborg Covenant Student Ministries.

Our first fundraiser is Saturday 9/30 where we will be doing a Car Wash from 10-2 PM at our Church. So don't wash your car now, let us do that for you!

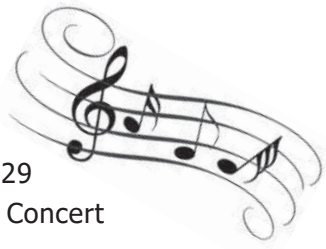

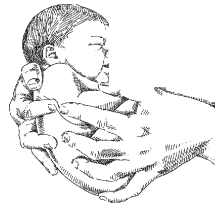

From the Connecting Women newsletter: "Since 2004, AVA (Advocacy for Victims of Abuse), as an integral part of Covenant Women Ministries, has been shedding light on forms of abuse and the misuse of power and control in relationships."

As abuse occurs in every community, we can help locally by collecting new or gently used purses filled with a few personal items, to be donated to a local intervention shelter. Often these women have fled a situation, and have no essential belongings with them. The purses were so appreciated by the recipients and the shelter staff when we did this project in 2012.

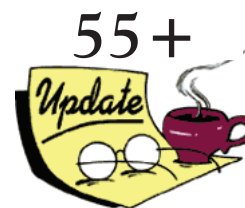

From Roy & Joi Christians, International School Project

“When you live in a world where everyone is a liar, and everyone is cheating--**IMEANEVERYONE!**--how do you resist becoming a liar and a cheat?”

An Albanian educator, was clearly wrestling with the material on ethics and Christian world view.

He and his wife, attended an ISP follow-up event, called a *Life Choices* seminar, where they both decided to follow Jesus. Since then, they have both studied the Bible an ISP director in Albania.

Now he seeks to share his faith with his students and colleagues. At the beginning of one school year, he wrote on the board to his 32 students: “I am blessed to be your teacher.” One student asked, “Why do you say you are blessed to be our teacher?”

He responded, “Because on this first day of school, I believe that there is the potential to increase my circle of friends by 32.” He hopes that every teacher in his school will write something like that on their board and impact their own students in a deeper way.

They are examples of how ISP is making a difference in Albania among and through educators. Please pray for an upcoming DreamMaker outreach on August 31 - September 9 in Albania.

Pray for: Roy and Joi are going to equip teachers in Guatemala at a Teachers’ Movement Launch Training - a training that will help launch new teachers’ movements in their countries. Pray for the 2 Colombians who will join us to get a vision for a teachers’ movement in their country. Joi then goes to Honduras to do a similar training.

From Covenant Kids Congo

On a hot afternoon in June, kids ages 10 to 17 gathered in a classroom in Gemena, DR Congo for a plenary session of the Young People’s Parliament. They sat around desks and discussed issues pertaining to children’s rights in DR Congo.



Pray for Missions

“Children know their own rights now and can express themselves,” said the president of the parliament after the plenary had concluded. “Kids can participate in making decisions in family and community. There is less violence toward children because of this parliament.”

This particular plenary was held on the World Day Against Child Labor, on June 12th. Child labor is one of the issues that the Young People’s Parliament has been addressing, along with child abuse, sexual violence, corruption, and educational matters. These young adults have been advocating for policies that protect and empower children.

The Young People’s Parliament began in 2013 with the support of Covenant Kids Congo powered by World Vision. While adult leaders provide guidance, the parliament is student-run. The young adults, who come from many different schools in Gemena, apply for the parliament. Each member serves a term of two years. About 100 young adults are currently participating.

This is the next generation of Congo—and the future is bright! The recent CKC Pastoral Vision Trip team had the opportunity to meet the Young People’s Parliament, and they were inspired.

“These young people blew us away with their ability to speak for justice,” said Pastor Anne Vining of First Covenant Church in St. Paul. She added, “I believe the DRC has hope if these young people are given a chance to lead.”

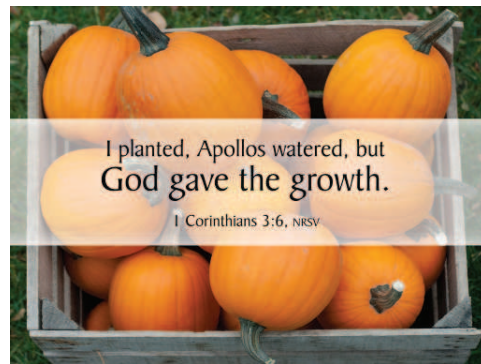

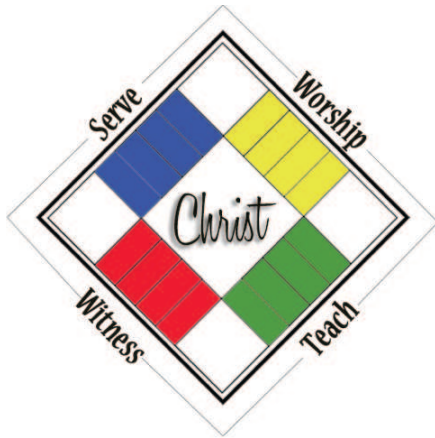
