## Message from Pastor Darrell

A Place at the Table

At the beginning of each year we (the pastors) choose a theme that we will focus on in our worship services throughout the year. For example, in 2009 we challenged everyone to read through the whole Bible together. We called it "Break the Spine in 2009, a reference to reading our Bibles so much that we wear them out. 2013 was "Remember by December", and we memorized a different passage of Scripture every month. Last year was missions. Each week we focused on a different missionary or ministry we do as a church.

This year's theme is "A Place at the Table," a focus on hospitality. Here is how we are defining biblical hospitality: Cheerfuly opening our heart and home to both believers and strangers, inviting them into our life by generously sharing the best of what we have with them. One way we are doing that is by encouraging our regular attenders to prepare a large meal before coming to church and then inviting visitors or people we don't know very well to our home for lunch.

In a recent sermon I mentioned that the number one reason people tell me they do not practice hospitality is that their house is too messy. They are too embarrassed by the condition of their house to have anyone over, and the thought of cleaning it all up to a presentable standard is too overwhelming.

I totally understand that. But can I offer this thought? What if someone invited you over to their house and when you got there it was absolutely immaculate? There was no clutter of any kind anywhere. There was no dust or dirt of any kind anywhere. Everything shone and sparkled like it was brand new. In fact, it looked as if no one really lived there at all, like the whole place was lifted right out of a picture in a Martha Stewart magazine. The food was perfect. The decor was perfect. The conversation was polite and perfect. In fact the only thing that wasn't perfect was... well... you.

Would that make you feel relaxed and comfortable? Would you feel like your host was someone you could really relate to, someone you wanted to spend more time with and get to know better? Perhaps not. It is hard to relate to perfection. Most of us live on a level somewhere below the stratosphere.

Now reverse it. What if your guests are not expecting, or even desiring, a house that looks and feels like a museum? What if they would feel much more at home in...well...your home, your real home, the place where you actually live, with a bit of clutter and a particle of dust or two?

I confess, I struggle with perfectionism, especially when it comes to hospitality. But I am learning that if I wait until my house is perfect before I practice hospitality, well, I am likely to get a bit out of practice. Could it be that the practice of hospitality is also a path to humility? And could it be that when I see your less-than-perfect house, it makes me feel safe to invite you over to mine?

So this year, what do you say we all just take a deep breath, close our eyes, and invite each other over?


