## Life Together

#### Message from Pastor Darrell

Do you ever feel inadequate or incomplete? Do you know why? It is because you are. You are inadequate and incomplete, and this is by design. God intentionally created us to be insufficient in and of ourselves.

Why would He do that? I believe He did it to foster relationships. God never intended for us to live life alone. He created us for community, with Him and with each other. And so to help nurture those relationships, He designed deliberate deficiency. In essence, He made us to need, not only Him, but one another. I need you, and you need me. We really do need each other.

In the Old Testament the chief remedy for loneliness and isolation was marriage. Your spouse and your biological family were your primary community. In the New Testament the chief remedy is the Church. The body of Christ becomes your first family, even prioritized over your biological family. (See Matthew 12:46-50)

And this is why there are so many “one another commands” in the New Testament. They are specific instructions for how to cultivate this community. I have collected and carefully counted them. Many of them are similar, so you could

group them together in slightly different ways. By my count there are 31 of them. I thought I would share a few brief observations about them.

Six of them are negative, such as “*Do not lie to each other,*” (Col 3:9) and “*Don’t grumble against each other.*” (James 5:9) The other 25 are positive, such as “*serve one another*” (Gal 5:13; 1 Peter 4:10) and “*carry each other’s burdens.*” (Gal 6:2)

Nine of them are repeated. For example, “*Live in harmony with one another.*” appears twice. (Rom 12:16; 1 Peter 3:8) As does, “*Instruct one another.*” (Rom 15:14; Col 3:16) Four times we are told to “*encourage one another.*” (1 Thess 4:18; 5:11; Heb 3:13; 10:25) What surprised me is that we are told to “*Greet one another with a holy kiss*” (Rom 16:16; 1 Cor 16:20; 2 Cor 13:12; 1 Peter 5:14) twice as often as we are told to “*forgive one another.*” (Col 3:13; Eph 4:32) (four times and two times, respectively.)

If you had to guess, which “one another” command do you think is most repeated? I am guessing you guessed right. “*Love one another*” is the clear winner. It appears at least 15 times (again, depending

on how you count). (John 13:34, 35; 15:12, 17; Rom 13:8; 1 Thess 3:12; 4:9; 1 Peter 3:8; 4:8; 1 John 3:11, 23; 4:7, 11, 12; 2 John 5) And, as you can see, John says it more than any other New Testament writer, a full 2/3 of the cases.

Well, I hope you have found this interesting (I am guessing my father will. ;-). Before I close, just for fun, here are some that might surprise you. We are commanded to sing to one another (Eph 5:19), wash each other’s feet (John 13:14), confess our sins to each other (James 5:16) and kiss each other (4 times!). Come to think of it, those things get progressively more intimate. Come to think of it, maybe that is the point.

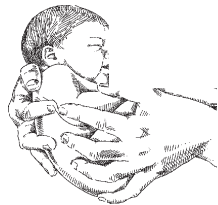

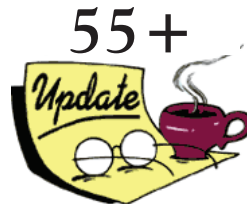
## Life Chain Sunday

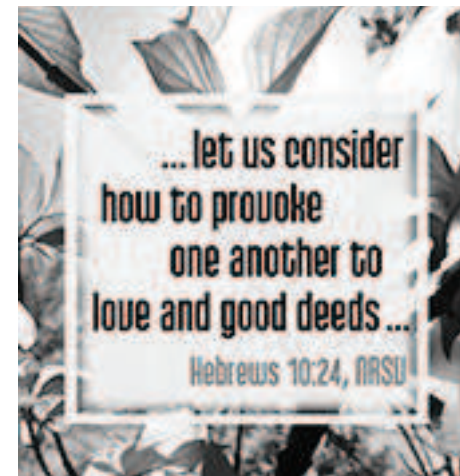


## Hospitality Ministry

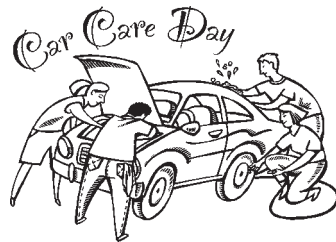

## Missions Reports

From Kara Peterson

Because Cambodia operates on a different semester system than the U.S., I'm currently on week fourteen of my "spring" semester. My summer will be in September! (Crazy, right?)

I'll be in Kansas in from September 13 - October 20 (speaking at our church on October 14) so if you want to get together and hear more about life here, let me know!

I'm moving to a new location in Cambodia. The place I'm moving to is called Kampong Thom, and it's decidedly more village than city. I will be teaching fourth-graders there at the newly inaugurated primary school.

Kampong Thom is very rural, and it's about two and a half hours from Phnom Penh. I will be trading the sewer rats of the city for the tarantulas and field rats of the province. I'll be trading the stifling heat of Phnom Penh for the slightly-more naturey village. I'll be teaching kiddos instead of university students. I'll have two teammates living with me instead of the large country team of 20+ that I'm used to as my community.

Don't worry, I will be safe out there. I'll live in a house with electricity and running water. I won't have a washing machine, so that will take a bit of getting used to (my options are to drive my laundry into the village or wash by hand). I won't have internet or reliable data on my phone, but there is a restaurant nearby with good WiFi and great Khmer food. Herbie (my cat) will be moving out there with me. I think he'll love all the nature and the variety of critters to catch.

As I process this, I remember I follow One who made the ultimate sacrifice. He is the example that we follow. "I am not my own, I have been bought with a price."

From Julie McLaughlin

Our first outreach in the Autonomous Region of Bougainville was to Nissan Atoll. It's a large Atoll North of Buka Island in Papua New Guinea with about 8,000 people living on it. We saw and helped 1211 of it's residents during our 6 days there.

Health Care:

- Primary Health Care: 363 patients seen
- Dental: 147 patients - 361 teeth extracted
- Immunizations: 243 patients vaccinated - 937 vaccines given
- Optometry: 447 patients seen - 349 reading glasses
- Eye surgeries performed: 11 patients

Nissan is a very isolated island and we had an issue with our water maker while we were there and I have never seen a team pull together so much. The team said, "we'll conserve water and do whatever we can to make sure we can stay so we can help more people." Amazingly, we were able to do all of the days of outreach that we had set out to do. Thanks to the crew and volunteers for such good teamwork.

Julie will be here September 30. Visit with her at a potluck after church that day.

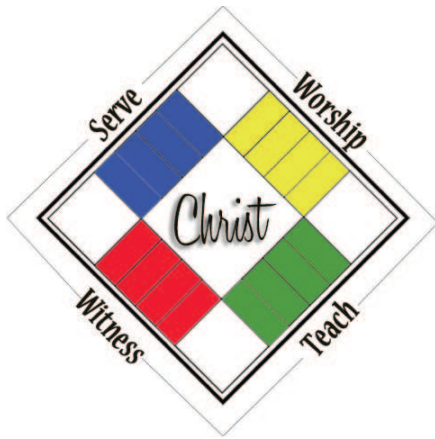
