Message from Pastor Jeff

Thousand of letters sent each year to God end up in a sorting office in Jerusalem. According to the Associated Press, the letters arrive from all over the world to the city's undeliverable mail department.

"We have hundreds of thousands of letters sent either to God or Jesus Christ, and for some reason they come to Jerusalem," said post office spokesman Yitzak Rabihiya.

In one letter an Israeli man asked God for 5,000 shekels (\$1,000), to ease his poverty. Postal workers were so moved that they took up a collection and sent him 4,300 shekels.

"After a month the same person wrote again to God," Mr. Rabihiya explained, "but this time he wrote, 'Thank you, God, for the contribution, but next time please don't send it through those postmen. They're thieves; they stole 700 shekels!'"

A significant characteristic of people who love Jesus is that they are THANKFUL. Paul says in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, "give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

Notice here that Paul does not say to give thanks "for" all situations. Rather he says give thanks "in" all situations. As believers we are not called to thank God for problems and pain, but we can

thank God in those problems that He is with us, and for the good that He will accomplish through the distress.

You see, Paul had learned that "in all things God works for the good of those who love Him" (Rm. 8:28). Learning to give thanks in everything means learning to trust God completely, knowing that he is in charge, and understanding that all that happens is part of a larger picture that believers may not see.

So as one of your pastors, I want to share with you some things that I am thankful for right now...

- my wife and best friend, Julie, who cares for me, encourages me, challenges me and comforts me.
- my children, Anna, Micah, Elijah, and Jacqueline. I enjoy watching them learn how to individually walk with the Lord.
- my church family, who wants to know, love, obey and follow God. I am many times overwhelmed by your generosity of time, talent and treasure to the Kingdom of God.
- my coworkers, staff and church board, who seek to lead God's people in truth and righteousness.







Missions Reports

From KICY Radio, Nome, Alaska

Last fall I was contacted by **Olivia Garretson**, a videographer and owner of Lightshaft Media who had heard of KICY at a Salmon Dinner at her church in Kansas. The story of the ministry impacted her, and she offered to come to Nome to use her gifts and skills to produce a short video or two about KICY for our use. She asked if she could come up for a week in the spring. While it would have been exciting for her to be here at Iditarod time, I knew she would get a better sense of the scope of our ministry if she came during the Annual Meeting of the Alaska Conference of the Covenant Church, which was to be held in Nome in April. She would then be able to speak with and film not only those listeners who are local, but also those from villages in our listening area who would be attending the conference.

And so, a few days prior to the start of the conference, Olivia and her assistant (her dad, Jeff) arrived in Nome. Her talent for telling a story was immediately apparent as she dove right in shooting video and Jeff asked pertinent questions. She produced a one minute "teaser" while here, which captured the essence of the ministry very well.

After a little more than a week in Nome, Olivia and Jeff returned to Kansas and the work of editing began. In late September I received an email from Olivia with the links to the finished products. Those two videos, one intended to be used by churches for 100% Sunday (ours will be in February), and one to be used for volunteer recruitment, are now on our website, kicy.org.

We are humbled Olivia has used her God given talents and giftings to bless KICY in this way.

From New Life Radio

Since the introduction of Russia's YAROVAYA laws on counterterrorism and restrictions on public and private evangelism in 2016 the Evangelical Church continues to scale back their public outreach and distribution of Christian literature and Bibles. Reports of nationwide harassment of believers and churches are more frequent and many Christians are often unsure if their actions are illegal.

Other faiths have been banned by law, and federal prosecutors are investigating at least 50 Jehovah's Witnesses in 16 Russian regions on "extremism" criminal charges, with many arrested in their homes at gunpoint, simply from exercising their beliefs. Who is NEXT?

Miraculously, New Life Radio is not impacted by these laws, and has even gained the Kremlin's permission to evangelize on a national basis after securing a ten year broadcast license and adding a second satellite giving them coast to coast coverage. The Lord has granted us an open door to proclaim the Gospel, and we are committed to providing NLR the means and the facility to be that public and private witness to Christ as Russian believers are prevented from doing so by law.


