

Message from Pastor Darrell

In the first verse of the last chapter of Isaiah, God says, "Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool. Where is the house you will build for me? Where will my resting place be?" God is so far above us and so far beyond us that if He were to hide from us, we could never find Him. We

would never be able to guess who He is or what He is like.

So the good news is that God has chosen to reveal Himself to us. In fact, He is, by nature, self-revealing. He wants us to know Him (and to know us), so He constantly com-



Perhaps a simple way to grasp general revelation is to imagine that Jesus never came and the Bible was never written. If we had never heard of Jesus and never seen a Bible, what could we still know about God?

Well, if we look at the creation around us we can learn quite a bit. We could know that some kind of god must exist, because there has to be an uncaused cause for all that is. Someone or something has to be eternal and self-existing to create the cosmos. And because of all the complex structures, systems, and information, that someone must be highly intelligent. And because of the sheer size of the universe and the energy it contains, this

creator must be extremely powerful.

So there is quite a bit we could know about this god simply by observing what it has made. But that information has its limits. For example, is this god a benevolent or malevolent being? It would be hard to

tell simply by looking at creation.

On the one hand, the sun is at just the right distance so it neither burns us up nor freezes us out (granted, based on recent weather patterns you might argue the latter point;-). And the rain falls to provide us food to eat and water to drink. And the air we breathe, the exact mixture of oxygen, nitrogen, and other gases, is just right to sustain our life. Those seem to be in the benevolent column.

On the other hand, there are often droughts and famines. There are severe weather patterns like tsunamis and tornados that are dangerous, even deadly. There are viruses, diseases, and even genetic mutations that kill and maim. Life can only be sustained by killing other living organisms, and even that only delays the inevitability of death. These seem to be in the malevolent column.

If we didn't have the Genesis account of creation and the fall, we might ascribe all the evil in the world to God and end up with a terribly distorted image of who He is. General revelation is not enough to know God, and since He wants us to know Him, He also gives us special revelation.

The two primary means of special revelation are the written Word of God - the Bible, and the living Word of God - Jesus. From the written Word we learn that God is a good and holy being with no darkness or sin in His heart. We are created in His image to be in relationship with Him as His children. We didn't trust Him at first and turned away from Him, cutting ourselves off from our source of life and light, and plunging the entire world into darkness and death. So God sent the living Word to rescue us from sin and death. Jesus lived the life we should have lived and died the death we should have died. And if we will put our faith in the person and work of the Son we can be reconciled to the Father, because once trust has been restored, so is the relationship.

And this is why we, the pastors, think the sermon series we are doing this year, "Where Is It Written?", is so important. There is so much we could not know about God if He didn't tell us through His Word. So the goal of our series is to know why we can trust it, how to interpret it, what it says, and how to demonstrate our trust in God by obeying His instructions. We pray that it will strengthen our hearts in the Kingdom of God and make us more effective in the culture of the world.



Make your favorite recipe to share or, if you don't cook, let Scott's do it for you! Potato chips - buns - or a jar of pickles would be welcomed.



The theme for the evening is our Heritage. Here are some interesting historical facts about our church.

In 1876, the congregation of 50 members was established and the first church building was constructed, which only a few months later was destroyed by a storm. The determined church family rebuilt again that year, building the Dome Church. The church continued to grow, and additions were built to accommodate their attendance.

Dan Johnson was one of the early settlers of Lindsborg, one of the charter members of the Covenant Church, and for years a trustee of the Mission Covenant Church in Lindsborg. He entered into a general mercantile business with his friend, C.R. Carlson, and with time his store became the biggest mercantile store in central Kansas (the three story building was located where

Swishers Firestone now stands). In August 13, 1875 he married Anna Kristin Nelson, and to this marriage five children were born. His daughter Evelyn married Theodore Anderson who became President of the Covenant Church of America for many years. His home, once a showplace in Lindsborg, still stands on the corner of Lincoln and Third.

In 1910 the young people's group raised money to put electric lights in the kitchen because candles started a fire in the church at Christmas.

In 1933 the first Vacation Bible School (VBS) was held.

In 1940 the church voted to discontinue all Swedish services.

Salt, a pinch


- 4 tbsp quality extra virgin olive oil

From Paul Carlson Partnership

There's a new opportunity in Congo to address poverty: the Karawa Coffee Project. This new economic development initiative seeks to revitalize the coffee industry in northwest Congo with goals to:

- reduce extreme poverty
- enhance food security
- build the local economy, and
- develop effective agricultural practices.

A triad partnership has been formed: the Covenant Church of Congo (CEUM), Café Africa DRC, and Paul Carlson Partnership. With

the help of a very generous donor to kick-start the project, the Karawa Coffee Project officially launched in December 2017.

Coffee production and export used to be a major cash crop in Congo before civil wars and coffee wilt disease destroyed the economy and many farms. What once was a source of income that many families relied upon, became only a memory. By training and equipping people to cultivate and export coffee, the local economy can be revitalized, increasing the livelihoods of thousands of families in the area.

The entire project is designed to be owned by farmers (the coffee producers). 1,400 producers signed up and have been receiving agricultural training to properly grow and nurture the disease-resistant seedlings into healthy Robusta coffee plants. Keeping management and profits within the associations, Paul Carlson Partnership is working with our partners to create a coffee producing and exporting enterprise that will endure through generations. In the words of our Congolese partners, "With coffee, we can build a better life today and a bright future for our children."
