

# May 2019 Life Together Lindsborg Covenant Church

## Message from Pastor Darrell

What if I told you that I had invented a time machine, and I offered to let you use it. There are two restrictions: 1. You can only go backwards to visit the past, and 2. You can only visit biblical events. Would you take the trip? If so, which Bible event would you choose? What story in Scripture would you most like to observe or experience for yourself?

Well, of course, I have no such machine, but you do - sort of. You have a tool, often under used and underdeveloped, that can take you there. It is called your imagination. Many of us as Christians get a little nervous when it comes to using our imaginations. After all, it seems a bit subjective. Perhaps we are afraid of wandering too far and becoming untethered from the Scriptures. Of course, that can happen, but our imagination is still a good gift from God, and I think He wants us to use them. There are few things as potent as a sanctified imagination.

One of my favorite ways of studying the Bible makes heavy use of the imagination. It is very simple. Just imagine that you are in the story yourself. For example, try this with the story of Elijah and the prophets of Baal in 1 Kings 18. That would have been a very dramatic encounter to see. Try reading through that chapter, slowly and meditatively. Pick one of the characters and try to imagine what it would have been like to be there and experience that event from their perspective.

Perhaps you will be Ahab, watching with fear and fascination as your prophets are humiliated and then executed. How does that make you feel? Angry? Afraid?

Or maybe you will be one of the prophets, dancing and shouting and even cutting yourself, desperately trying to get Baal's attention. Imagine how the hope and confidence you feel in the morning fades into exhaustion in the afternoon as you suffer from fatigue and blood loss. And perhaps by evening you have sunk into a pit of despair.

You could be just a spectator in the crowd, watching the showdown take place. What is it like to hear hundreds of Baal's prophets chanting their prayers and calling on him to send fire? Which side are you rooting for? Do you feel sorry for the pathetic prophets as Baal seems to have forsaken them? Are you squeamish? Do the self-inflicted wounds and the flow of blood make you shudder? Do you think that Elijah is a fool to drench his sacrifice in water, making it very difficult to catch

fire? How do you feel when Elijah wastes hundreds of gallons of precious water, some of the last drops left after three years of drought? What is it like to see a huge ball of fire fall from the sky? How loud does it roar? Can you feel the heat, even when standing at a safe distance? Can you smell the meat roasting on the altar? Can you see the expressions on the faces of the false prophets? Are they shocked? Dismayed? Afraid? Do you stay and watch the execution of the false prophets? Do you participate? What do you think of him now?

There are not a lot of rules for this approach, but there are a lot of questions. Ask yourself, "What do I see, hear, smell, taste, feel?" Try to immerse yourself deeply into the story as a single character and experience the whole thing from their vantage point. Then switch characters and do it again to try to gain yet another perspective. You might be surprised what you can learn about God, about life, and even about yourself. I "imagine" that you will find this exercise both fun and fruitful.

## Three Steps to Studying the Scriptures

- 1 Observation What does the passage say?
  - A. Ask the 5 "W" Questions:
    - Who are the people in the passage? Who is speaking?
    - What is happening in the passage?
    - When in time do these events occur (time of day, time of year & in history)
    - Where is the story taking place?
    - Why is something being said? Why will this happen? Why to these people?

B. Keep your eyes open for:

- Key words or phrases (ie, action words and adjectives)
- Repeated words (many times the main point of a passage, 1 Cor. 13)
- Contrasts/Comparisons (Mt. 5:21-22)
- Cause & Effect (Mt. 25:21)
- "If, then" statements (2 Chronicles 7:14)
- Transitional Words: "and, but, or, yet, therefore, now, then, in order that, so that, because"
- 2 Interpretation What does the passage mean?

Goal of Interpretation: discover the main idea (thought) of the passage

- Tools to use in the Interpretation step:
  - Use your observations from step 1
  - Define words
  - Use cross references (compare Scripture with Scripture)
  - Consider the context of the verse/passage

Write the meaning of the passage in one sentence

3 - Application - What am I going to do about what the passage says and means?

Four application questions to ask and answer:

- 1 How does the truth revealed in this passage affect my relationship with God?
- 2 How does the truth revealed in this passage affect my relationship with others?
- $\boldsymbol{3}$  How does the truth revealed in this passage affect me?
- 4 How does the truth revealed in this passage affect my response to the enemy?
