Message from Pastor Jeff

Once upon a time there were two men in a wood-chopping contest. They were tasked with chopping down as many trees in the forest as they could from sun-up to sun-down. The winner would be rewarded with both fame and fortune.

From morning till noon, both men steadily chopped and chopped. By noon they were neck and neck, but then one man took a break and stopped chopping. The other man saw this and thought to himself: "The lazy fool, he's probably taking a break for lunch. He's given me a chance to get ahead of him and I will without a doubt win this contest!"

A while later the man got back to work. As the day continued he chopped more trees than his hard-working (and hungry) competitor and by mid-afternoon he had taken a clear lead.

When sundown came, the man who had taken the break at noon had chopped almost twice as many trees as the other man, who was drenched in sweat, hungry and exhausted.

"How did you beat me?" he asked puzzled. "You were lazier than I and even took a break for lunch!"

"Ah," said the other man, "I did take a break, but it was during that break, that I sharpened my axe."

The moral of the story: Taking time out to sharpen your axe brings great reward.

When you give us pastors sabbatical leave, you are heeding the moral of this story and allowing us to "sharpen our axe" so we can be effective for ministry by giving us time to refresh, renew, recharge. In the course of a day, a pastor can deal with death, deep spiritual issues, great encouragement, petty criticisms, tragedies, illnesses, and celebrations of birth. The emotional roller coaster is draining. Pastoral burnout is high. I have heard that in 10 years, half of seminary graduates are no longer in ministry. This statistic was true for my graduating class at North Park Seminary.

Ten years ago, you, as a church blessed the pastoral staff with sabbatical leave: a three month rest from pastoral duties so we can study and rest. Pastor Darrell will be taking his sabbatical break for the months of July through September.

You will see him and his family around town during this break. Don't be afraid to greet him, and visit with him. But if you have ministry questions or concerns during these 3 months, please bring them to Pastor Jeremy or myself.

You are such a nurturing church that blesses and cares for your pastors. Thank you for giving us the chance to sharpen our axes!

Missions Reports

From Christian Radio for Russia- Sponsor of the New Life Satellite Network—
Moscow, Russia

Russia's Sovereign Internet Law passes and may impact NLR operations.

WE ASK FOR PRAYERS of protection that this law would not hinder NLR's domestic and global

Internet radio at www.NLRadio.net nor force a shutdown of our signal sent outside of Russia's borders to our Hotbird satellite uplink site in Israel that delivers our satellite radio broadcasts to 40 nations.

CRFR has contingency plans in place should this event occur. In April 2019, CRFR met with representatives from

JEWS FOR JESUS (JFJ) in Tel Aviv to present a strategy for introducing young Slavic immigrants to NLR's broadcasts via satellite and Internet radio. There are over 2 million Russian-speakers living in Israel and the opportunity to work with the Messianic Jewish community presents a tremendous outreach potential that we trust will bear fruit in the future. NLR can broadcast new programming from JFJ Slavic partners in Israel to target youth tuned into us globally!

"New Life Radio, we love you very much! Thank you very much for your work. The Living Father speaks through you! You have a lot of listeners here in Kamchatka! Alexander (note: Kamchatka is 8 time zones to the east of Moscow)

From Paul & Sheryl Noren

In the past few months we planted out about an acre of a wild species of coffee native to our forests here. This species has some potential as a new special niche crop. I think the coffee from it is quite good. It has a bit of a chocolate flavor.

We were also able to plant 1.25 acres of new pine-

apple plants. We would have liked to plant more than that but needed to be careful with our spending. Last year's plants are looking good now and are setting on fruit for the new season.

I have been working with a fishculture project at Karawa that is going well. Thanks to Covenant missionary, Randy Bevis, we have

some new highly selected Tilapia that are responding to the feed we are making in an amazing way. Even Randy was amazed at the growth rates and said it was impossible to get that kind of growth with what we were feeding the fish. Until... I told him about supplementing termites three times a day in addition to the other food. Anyway, our fish weights were two weeks ahead of the commercial Tilapia feeding chart that I am following. That was on Sept. 23rd, at three months from hatching. They already looked like the six-month old Tilapia we have locally.

We started a new mushroom growing experiment at Loko just before we left for Cameroon. Mushrooms are very much a part of the diet around here. Producing them may prove to be something some people could do to help their income. It's an experiment, so, we will have to report on that later.

We are also working on several other projects that I hope to report on at another time. These include Vanilla, a palm species that produces "olive oil", Black pepper, and tea, to mention a few.
