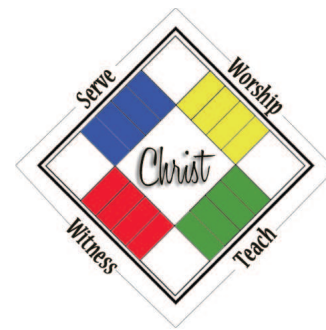
I share this experience with you so that you will know how important your support and your donations are to our work with housing for low income families in McPherson County.

Message from Pastor Darrell

One of the authors of a book I am reading told a story that really surprised me. He was working as a teacher at a Christian school in Indonesia. He gave his students their first test. Part of it was multiple choice. As he was grading the tests he was puzzled to discover that some of the students left some of the questions unanswered. As he was returning the tests he commented to one of the students,

"Hey, I noticed that you didn't answer all of the questions. Why was that?"

The student replied, "Because I didn't know the correct answer."

The professor said, "Oh, well, it was a multiple choice test. You should have at least guessed."

The student stared back at him in bewilderment. "But what if I had accidentally guessed the correct answer? That would give the impression that I knew the answer when I didn't, and that would be lying."

The professor started to try to argue that guessing is not the same as lying, but stopped himself when he realized that he was trying to persuade this earnest young follower of Jesus to lower his standard of personal integrity. The whole encounter

made him pause to reconsider his own standards for truth telling.

And I must admit, it did the same for me. Growing up in a western culture I am like that professor. It never occurred to me to consider the possibility that guessing on a multiple choice exam could be a form of deceit. Lying isn't so much a matter of speech as it is a motive of the heart. If my intent is to deceive someone, then I am lying, whether I speak or not. Based on that criteria, guessing on such a test comes dangerously close to that line, if it doesn't cross it altogether.

This is a great example of why we need each other. We all tend to have blind spots, areas of our lives in which we are believing or behaving in a manner that breaks God's heart. But we don't all have the same blind spot. This means that I may be able to see yours and you may be able to see mine. And, oftentimes the thing I simply cannot see is patently obvious to you. So, if we are in regular fellowship, we can act as mirrors for one another (hopefully kind and gracious ones).

To put it succinctly, we need each other. If we walk together we can help each other know God better, see ourselves more clearly, and therefore

(From November) Advancing Work..

I went searching through photos to try to update everyone on what I've been doing the past few months. I realized meeting with Government officials and working on the agreements in order to bring the ship into a nation or province isn't exactly something you get a lot of pictures from. Rather, I have a lot of pictures, but not one of them is actually working. Much of what I'm doing right now, is opening doors in places and things that will make it possible for our ships to visit places in the future. Important but not very photogenic. All that to say, it can sometimes be a slow process and involves a lot of waiting and chasing.

Merry Christmas. This is my first Christmas in I can't remember how many years that I'm home in Kansas for. What a treat. It's Christmas Eve as a write this and celebrating with Family.

I've been able to enjoy some time state--side and catching up with friends. I'll still speak at a few Churches, Cheney the 28th, but mostly I'm able to enjoy some down time. It will be back to Kona next week.

Some historic days last month as the Referendum for Independence just finished. 97% of the population voted for Independence, so if PNG ratifies it, then Bougainville may become the newest nation on earth.

One of the delights of being back in Kansas is that I get to see my nieces and my nephew. I love to hang out with them. I don't get to see them very often so we usually try to do something special...pizza and Star Wars night. A part of a long standing tradition.

My heart is full of joy as this Christmas season in classrooms in Romania, Lebanon, Zimbabwe, Ecuador, Mongolia, Russia, and in many other countries, teachers like Oksana in Siberia have been sharing with their students how Christ was born as a baby in order to offer salvation to us.

Throughout this year we have seen God doing remarkable things, often in the midst of opposition. I have been thrilled by the multiplication of communities of Christian teachers who are reaching out with the Gospel, not only to their students, but to their colleagues,

families of the students, and their communities. 28 countries around the world are being spiritually impacted by the work of ISP. The Lord is going before us, opening new doors into countries you would not expect to be responsive to a Christian presence. We hold trainings in Muslim schools in the Middle East and Central Asia, with Buddhists in South East Asia, and in secular schools in many corners of the world. This past year we have seen the ministry expand into new countries on every continent and spreading deeper into the countries in which we currently minister. Our vision with ISP is for a community of Christ-directed teachers in every city and village who are spiritually influencing the educational community.

Please continue to pray. We feel the effects of your prayers for us. Daily a spiritual battle is taking place for the soul of every teacher, student, and parent with whom we are sharing the love of Christ. Spiritual battle is real and we are seeing incredible, I might even say at times miraculous, answers to prayer. More and more this year, I felt the burden for prayer as the leader of ISP. 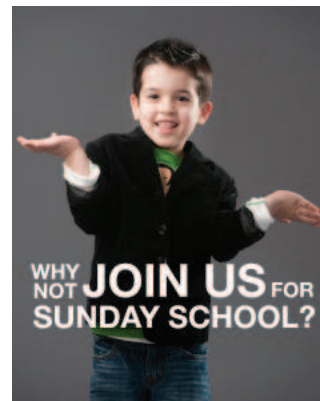

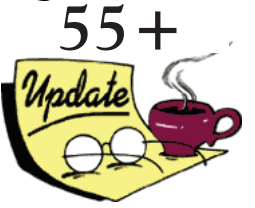

Covenant Cedars Jr. High Camp will be the week of July 5 and Sr. High the week of July 12.

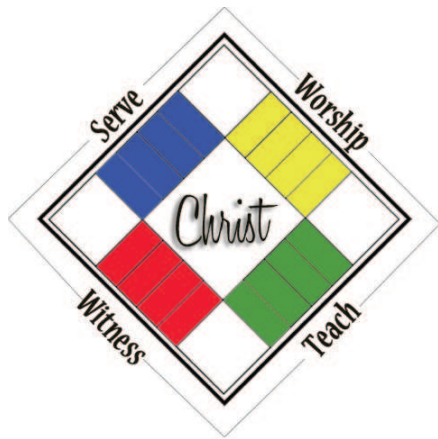
Our church has a camp fund which simplifies payments made to the camps and makes camp cost-easier on families. Installment payments of any size can be
